ORDINANCE NO. 5-7-12

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RAINSVILLE, ALABAMA, TO EXEMPT CERTAIN "COVERED ITEMS" FROM THE MUNICIPAL SALES AND USE TAX DURING CERTAIN PERIODS, AS AUTHORIZED BY ACT 2012-256, GENERALLY REFERRED TO AS THE STATE SEVERE WEATHER PREPAREDNESS SALES TAX HOLIDAY LEGISLATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF RAINSVILLE, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. In conformity with the provisions Act 2012-256 enacted by the Alabama Legislature during the 2012 Regular Session, providing for a State Sales Tax Holiday, the City of Rainsville, Alabama, exempts "covered items" from municipal sales and use tax during the same period, beginning at 12:01 a.m. on the first Friday in July 2012 (July 6, 2012) and ending at twelve midnight the following Sunday (July 8, 2012), and on the last full weekend of February each year thereafter until rescinded, beginning at 12:01 a.m. on Friday of the last full weekend in February and ending at twelve midnight the following Sunday.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be subject to all terms, conditions, definitions, time periods, and rules as provided by Act 2012-256.

Section 3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this ordinance under the seal of the City of Rainsville, Alabama, and to forward said certified copy to the Alabama Department of Revenue to be recorded and posted on the Department website.

Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective on June 1, 2012.
